

### Messages from the Executive Director

### Alcoholic beverages:

Residents can consume alcoholic beverages with the proper consents along with a Doctor's order. Visitors, including the family and friends of residents are <u>no longer</u> permitted to drink alcohol on the Home's property or outdoor areas. Yes, this is a change in past practice. We apologize. However, it is not within the Home's mandate to offer alcohol to anyone other than the Home's residents. At resident events, Oakcrossing staff will offer family and friends non-alcoholic beverages.

When planning a special party at Oakcrossing with your family and friends, the Home has several rooms that can be booked to accommodate these celebrations.

For special family occasions, permission from the Home's Administrator to host an event and obtain a "Special Occasion Permit" must be obtained. A "Special Occasion Permit" for a Private Event can be obtained by contacting the Liquor Control Board of Ontario (LCBO). The family/resident hosting the event must also purchase liability insurance with coverage in the amount of a minimum of \$1,000,000.

Please contact Main Reception at 519-641-0021 ext. 100 to book a room. You can contact Lynda Monik, Executive Director at ext. 103 to obtain permission to host an event offering alcohol.

#### Accreditation

peopleCare Communities Inc. will participate in an Accreditation Canada process from November 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Information about accreditation will be shared with residents, families, staff, students and volunteers.

Surveyors, will ask to meet with many residents during their visit to the home. Surveyors, will ask to meet with a resident who has lived at the Home for a long time, a new admission, a resident with a wound, a resident who has fallen, a resident who was recently transferred to hospital (returned from hospital) and a resident who experiences behaviours related to their diagnosis.

# Recreation Excursions and Special Events

Throughout the course of the year there will be many fun bus trips and special events planned for residents to participate in, in addition to regualr scheduled recreation programs.

We do rely heavily on our volunteers and family members to make these events possible. The more help we have, the more residents are able to participate! So that being said, we encourage family members to attend these events along with your loved one whenever possible.

### Bus Trips (Excursions)

To allow for more residents to attend an excursion we ask that family members if wishing to come along, drive seperate and meet us there to allow for more room on the bus for residents.

While we understand that many residents would like to attend every excursion or speical event, we cannot always accommodate this request Space is very limited on/at special events and bus excursions.

The bus holds approx 10 people, and therefore residents will be offered to attend bus excursions on a rotational basis.

The recreation team will ensure there is a fair rotation and that interested residents receive opportunities to participate in excursions and special events offered at Oakcrossing.
